Lesson Components

BIG IDEA

The Big Idea section stimulates students' interest and gives them a wider understanding of the chapter's theme.



Contents Map

The Contents Map section previews the content covered in each lesson and presents the unifying theme.

Warm Up

The Warm Up question section prepares students for the lesson by asking them about something related to the topic.

Background Link

The Background Link section offers students background information and interesting activities that help motivate them to read the passage and understand it better.



Key Words

The Key Words section highlights the key words from the lesson and includes a picture alongside each word.




Let's Focus

The Let's Focus section encourages students to think about the main idea as they read through the passage.

Link to Self

The Link to Self section allows students to relate ideas from the passage to their own lives or to think critically about what they have read.



Reading Comprehension

In this section, students' understanding of the passage is checked through a series of multiple-choice and short-answer questions.

Find Evidence

The Find Evidence section encourages students to closely focus on the meaning of individual words and sentences by finding evidence from the text to answer comprehension questions. Both detail and inference questions are included.

Graphic Organizer

The Graphic Organizer section helps students to outline and summarize the passage.



Vocabulary Worksheet

After studying the Key Words section, students apply what they have learned using the Vocabulary Worksheet. While answering questions that include the key words, students can activate their prior knowledge or experience and reinforce their learning.

Let's Focus

How much water does each daily activity need?

Everyone needs water. How much water do you use in one day? It may be much more than you think!

First, think about your day at home. You wake up in the morning and **drink** water. Most people drink about two **liters** of water each day.



Second, you eat food with your family. Cooking and washing dishes use about sixty liters of water.

Third, you use the **toilet** and **flush** it. Each flush washes away around ten liters of water.

Last, you take a **shower** at night. It uses about twenty liters of water every minute.

You use hundreds of liters of water every day!
